It's Not Right! Changing the Conversation on Abuse of Older Adults



Ontario is changing the conversation to stop abuse of older adults. In January 2017, the Ministry of Seniors Affairs, Elder Abuse Ontario and Western University launched a provincial initiative to educate Ontarians as bystanders. Bystanders are those neighbours, friends and family members who are most often first to see warning signs with someone they know, but do not know how to respond. In 2017, we were able to reach more than 11,000 people through the “It’s Not Right” (INR) movement and we are hoping to continue to increase awareness in 2018. We want people of all ages to be able to recognize warning signs of abuse and to know how to respond safely and effectively.
